Celebrating 20 Years

The MRC began at a national level in 2002, following President George W. Bush's State of the Union Address, to improve overall health and safety in the United States. This was established with the Office of the Surgeon General and the Human Services' Office of the Assistant Secretary for Health with community-based projects to strengthen local health. Today, there are over 800 Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) units and over 300,000 MRC volunteers across the country.

The Putnam County MRC was founded following the development of the Putnam County Bioterrorism Task Force which was formed after September 11th. The Putnam County MRC was registered in July 2004 and became a member of the Citizen Corps Council in January 2005. The Putnam County Department of Health (PCDOH) serves as the housing authority. Throughout its history, the Putnam County MRC has assisted with PCDOH emergency preparedness activities. In 2005, at one of the first Point of Dispensing (POD) exercises, MRC volunteers were trained, activated and utilized. Since then up to the present, MRC volunteers have participated in drills, exercises and real-life events. MRC volunteers have worked alongside PCDOH staff during drills and exercises, influenza clinics, large scale PODs and COVID-19 activities.

MRC National Summit

May 22-24, 2024 - Chicago, IL

Message from our Preparedness Coordinator - Connie Bueti:

From May 22 – 24, I was fortunate to participate in the National MRC Conference In Chicago, Ill. Over 600 MRC leaders from all over the country attended. The theme of the conference, "The Power of Community, Collaboration, and Connection: MRC Leading the Way for the Next 20 Years," provided an opportunity to reflect on the successes of the network's growth and value during the first 20 years and discover ways to expand our reach in communities to position the network for continued excellence.

Day one opened with the general session, "Celebration of the MRC and Reflection on the COVID-19 Response," which included a chat with National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) and Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response (ASPR) leadership. Throughout the first day, participants learned from peers in over 30 presentation sessions based on the MRC Factors for Success (FFS). A Lunch & Learn session explored the critical and overlooked concepts of Spontaneous Responders in the Disaster Gap: the smallest (biggest) interval you've never heard of and steps to creating an MRC team to address mental health needs after a critical incident.

Day two opened with an overview of current and future partnership opportunities between the American Red Cross and Medical Reserve Corps units and volunteers. Participants then joined over 25 special learning sessions and workshops on a range of topics. MRC State Coordinators also gathered to share best practices and examine opportunities to strengthen the MRC network. The second day of the conference concluded with leaders exploring posters and resource tables and networking with peers.

The final day of the conference opened with a discussion on the need for a shift from crisis-driven care to one that adds evidence-based prevention. Unit leaders then joined peers in their regions to connect and share best practices. Colleagues from Region II (NJ, NY, PR, USVI) were addressed by Teresa Blakeslee, ASPR MRC Region II Liaison and Jack Porter, NYS Dept. of Health Volunteer Program Coordinator. All Region II units received a Certificate of Appreciation from Teresa.

Throughout the conference, I was able to network with fellow unit leaders and bring back lots of good information and ideas to implement.
